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- The word "tsunami" (pronounced soo-NAH-mee) is derived from 2 Japanese words, "tsu" meaning harbour and "nami" meaning wave.
- A tsunami is usually a series of travelling ocean waves and the first wave is often not the largest. The next wave may be bigger, and the tsunami may last for hours.

- More than 80% of the world's tsunamis were caused by earthquakes.
- The travel time for a local tsunami is generally less than 1 hour, and may be as little as 10 minutes.
- Where the ocean is very deep, tsunami waves can travel as fast as a commercial jet. This means that a tsunami can move

- from one side of an ocean to the other in less than a day.
- A small tsunami at one beach can be a giant wave a few miles away.
- If a Tsunami Warning is issued, NEVER go down to the beach to watch the waves come in.
